May 2015

Euro area unemployment rate at 11.1%

EU28 at 9.6%

The **euro area**¹ (EA19) seasonally-adjusted² unemployment rate³ was 11.1% in May 2015, stable compared with April 2015⁴, and down from 11.6% in May 2014. This is the lowest rate recorded in the **euro area** since March 2012. The **EU28**¹ unemployment rate was 9.6% in May 2015, also stable compared with April 2015 and down from 10.3% in May 2014. This is the lowest rate recorded in the **EU28** since July 2011. These figures are published by **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**.


Eurostat estimates that 23.348 million men and women in the **EU28**, of whom 17.726 million in the **euro area**, were unemployed in May 2015. Compared with April 2015, the number of persons unemployed decreased by 38 000 in the **EU28** and by 35 000 in the **euro area**. Compared with May 2014, unemployment fell by 1.575 million in the **EU28** and by 939 000 in the **euro area**.

Member States

Among the Member States, the lowest unemployment rate in May 2015 was recorded in **Germany** (4.7%), and the highest in **Greece** (25.6% in March 2015) and **Spain** (22.5%).

Compared with a year ago, the unemployment rate in May 2015 fell in twenty-two Member States, increased in five and remained stable in Cyprus. The largest decreases were registered in **Lithuania** (11.0% to 8.2%), **Spain** (24.7% to 22.5%) and **Ireland** (11.7% to 9.8%). The increases were registered in **Belgium** (8.4% to 8.6%), **France** (10.1% to 10.3%), **Romania** (6.8% to 7.1%), **Austria** (5.6% to 6.0%) and **Finland** (8.6% to 9.4%).

In May 2015, the unemployment rate in the **United States** was 5.5%, up from 5.4% in April 2015 and down from 6.3% in May 2014.



Youth unemployment

In May 2015, 4.707 million young persons (under 25) were unemployed in the EU28, of whom 3.136 million were in the euro area. Compared with May 2014, youth unemployment decreased by 450 000 in the EU28 and by 300 000 in the euro area. In May 2015, the youth unemployment rate⁵ was 20.6% in the EU28 and 22.1% in the euro area, compared with 22.2% and 23.8% respectively in May 2014. In May 2015, the lowest rates were observed in Germany (7.1%), Denmark (10.0%) and Austria (10.1%), and the highest in Greece (49.7% in March 2015), Spain (49.3%), Croatia (43.6% in the first quarter 2015) and Italy (41.5%).

The euro area (EA19) includes Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland. The EU28 includes Belgium, Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Croatia, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland, Sweden and the United Kingdom.

- 3. Eurostat produces harmonised unemployment rates for individual EU Member States, the euro area and the EU. These unemployment rates are based on the definition recommended by the International Labour Organisation (ILO). The measurement is based on a harmonised source, the European Union Labour Force Survey (LFS). Based on the ILO definition, Eurostat defines unemployed persons as persons aged 15 to 74 who:
 - are without work;
 - are available to start work within the next two weeks;
 - and have actively sought employment at some time during the previous four weeks.

The unemployment rate is the number of people unemployed as a percentage of the labour force. The labour force is the total number of people employed plus unemployed. In this news release unemployment rates are based on employment and unemployment data covering persons aged 15 to 74.

- 4. The data in this News Release can be subject to revisions, caused by: updates to the seasonally adjusted series whenever new monthly data are added; the inclusion of the most recent LFS data in the calculation process; update of seasonal adjustment models with complete annual data; inclusion of new weights in the LFS data due to the 2011 Census. Compared with the rates published in News Release 98/2015 of 3 June 2015, the April 2015 unemployment rates were revised downwards from 9.7% to 9.6% for the EU28 and remained unchanged at 11.1% for the EA19. Among Member States, rates have been revised by more than 0.1 percentage points (pp) downwards for Croatia (by 1.3 pp), Bulgaria (by 0.3 pp), France (by 0.3 pp), Portugal and Slovakia (both by 0.2 pp). Revisions of more than 0.1 percentage points upwards have been observed for Cyprus (by 0.4 pp), Belgium, Greece and Latvia (all three by 0.2 pp).
- 5. The youth unemployment rate is the number of people aged 15 to 24 unemployed as a percentage of the labour force of the same age. Therefore, the youth unemployment rate should not be interpreted as the share of jobless people in the overall youth population. - 6. Latvia: quarterly data for all series. Croatia, Cyprus, Romania and Slovenia: quarterly data for youth unemployment.
- 7. For Germany, the Netherlands, Austria, Finland, Sweden and Iceland the trend component is used instead of the more volatile seasonally adjusted data. For Sweden and Iceland, seasonally adjusted data are available in the online database on the Eurostat website: http://ec.europa.eu/eurostat/data/database
- 8. For Denmark, Estonia, Hungary, Portugal, the United Kingdom and Norway 3-month moving averages of LFS data are used instead of pure monthly indicators.


